# Report on Internal Control over Financial Reporting and on Compliance and Other Matters Based on an Audit of Financial Statements Performed in Accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*

## **Independent Auditors' Report**

To the Board of Directors of Metro Community Development, Inc. Flint, Michigan

We have audited, in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the financial statements of Metro Community Development, Inc. as of and for the year ended June 30, 2017, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise Metro Community Development, Inc.'s basic financial statements, and have issued our report thereon dated November 1, 2017.

#### **Internal Control Over Financial Reporting**

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered Metro Community Development, Inc.'s internal control over financial reporting to determine the audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified. We did identify a deficiency in internal control, described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as item 2016-001 that we consider to be a significant deficiency.

#### **Compliance and Other Matters**

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether Metro Community Development, Inc.'s financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

#### **Response to Finding**

Metro Community Development, Inc.'s response to the finding identified in our audit and the corrective action plan is described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. Metro Community Development, Inc.'s response was not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and, accordingly, we express no opinion on it.

## **Independent Auditors' Report**

To the Board of Directors of Metro Community Development, Inc. Flint, Michigan

#### **Report on Compliance for Each Major Federal Program**

We have audited Metro Community Development, Inc.'s compliance with the types of compliance requirements described in the *OMB Compliance Supplement* that could have a direct and material effect on each of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2017. Metro Community Development, Inc.'s major federal programs are identified in the summary of auditors' results section of the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs.

#### Management's Responsibility

Management is responsible for compliance with federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of its federal awards applicable to its federal programs.

#### Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on compliance for each of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s major federal programs based on our audit of the types of compliance requirements referred to above. We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; and the audit requirements of Title 2 U.S. *Code of Federal Regulations* Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (Uniform Guidance). Those standards and the Uniform Guidance require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether noncompliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program occurred. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence about Metro Community Development, Inc.'s compliance with those requirements and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion on compliance for each major federal program. However, our audit does not provide a legal determination of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s compliance.

#### Opinion on Each Major Federal Program

In our opinion, Metro Community Development, Inc. complied, in all material respects, with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2017.

#### **Report on Internal Control over Compliance**

Management of Metro Community Development, Inc. is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above. In planning and performing our audit of compliance, we considered Metro Community Development, Inc.'s internal control over compliance with the types of requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each major federal program to determine the auditing procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing an opinion on compliance for each major federal program and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with the Uniform Guidance, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s internal control over compliance.

A deficiency in internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program on a timely basis. A material weakness in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A significant deficiency in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over compliance that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control over compliance, as described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as item 2017-002, that we consider to be a significant deficiency.

Metro Community Development, Inc.'s response to the internal control over compliance finding identified in our audit is described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs and corrective action plan. Metro Community Development, Inc.'s response was not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of compliance and, accordingly, we express no opinion on the response or corrective action plan.

The purpose of this report on internal control over compliance is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over compliance and the results of that testing based on the requirements of the Uniform Guidance. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.



#### Report on Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards Required by the Uniform Guidance

We have audited the financial statements of Metro Community Development, Inc. as of and for the year ended June 30, 2017, and have issued our report thereon dated November 1, 2017 which contained an unmodified opinion on those financial statements. In our opinion, the schedule of expenditures of federal awards is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

#### Note 1 - Basis of Presentation

The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards (the Schedule) includes the federal award activity of Metro Community Development, Inc. under programs of the federal government for the year ended June 30, 2017. The information in this Schedule is presented in accordance with the requirements of Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations Part 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (Uniform Guidance). Because the Schedule presents only a selected portion of the operations of Metro Community Development, Inc., it is not intended to and does not present the financial position, changes in net assets, or cash flows of Metro Community Development, Inc.

#### Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### **Expenditures**

Expenditures reported on the Schedule are reported on the accrual basis of accounting. Such expenditures are recognized following, as applicable, either the cost principles contained in the Uniform Guidance, or OMB Circular A-122 Cost Principles for Non-Profit Organizations where certain types of expenditures are not allowable or are limited as to reimbursement.

#### **Indirect Cost Rate**

Metro Community Development, Inc. has elected not to use the 10 percent de minimis indirect cost rate as allowed under the Uniform Guidance.

#### Note 3 - Loans or Loan Guarantees

reclassify line items to ensure the financial statements are presented in accordance with US GAAP.

Cause and Effect: The Organization's external accounting firm was changed at year-end, additionally the year end closing

checklist developed by management was not followed completely. This resulted in certain accounts and line

items not being properly reconciled or stated as of June 30, 2017.

Recommendation: We recommend that the Organization follow its year-end closing checklist to ensure all general ledger

accounts are reconciled to supporting schedules timely and that the reconciliations be reviewed by an

appropriate member of management.

#### Finding 2017-002 – Significant Deficiency in Internal Control

checklist developed by management was not followed completely. This resulted in adjustments during the

audit process to agree the schedule of federal expenditures to the revenue reported on the general ledger.

Questioned Cost: \$0

**Recommendation:** We recommend that expenditures to be reported in the SEFA be reconciled to the associated revenues

reported in the general ledger on a monthly basis, and that the reconciliation also identify the CFDA numbers

and pass-through agency along with identifying amounts which are passed through to sub-recipients.

#### **Federal Awards Findings**

There were no findings or questioned costs for Federal Awards for the year ended June 30, 2016.



#### Corrective Action Plan

Management is in agreement with the findings identified in the Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs. Below details our plans to correct the finding identified:

2017-001 Record all Year-end Closing Journal Entries

Management is in the process of reorganizing the accounting department and enhancing year-end close procedures after turnover in its external accounting firm. As part of the reorganization, the CEO will re-align responsibilities for the accounts to be reconciled and the CEO, or his designee, will review all reconciliations required by the checklist to ensure they have been completed timely. The reorganization and implementation of the enhanced procedures are expected to be completed during 4th guarter 2017.

2017-002 Ensure SEFA is Complete

Management concurs with the finding and will incorporate a procedure into the accounting procedures checklist used by internal and external accounting staff of the Organization to reconcile all expenditures to be reported on the SEFA to the associated revenues in the general ledger. The reconciliations will be reviewed by the CEO, or his designee, and implementation of this new process is expected to be completed during 4th quarter 2017.
